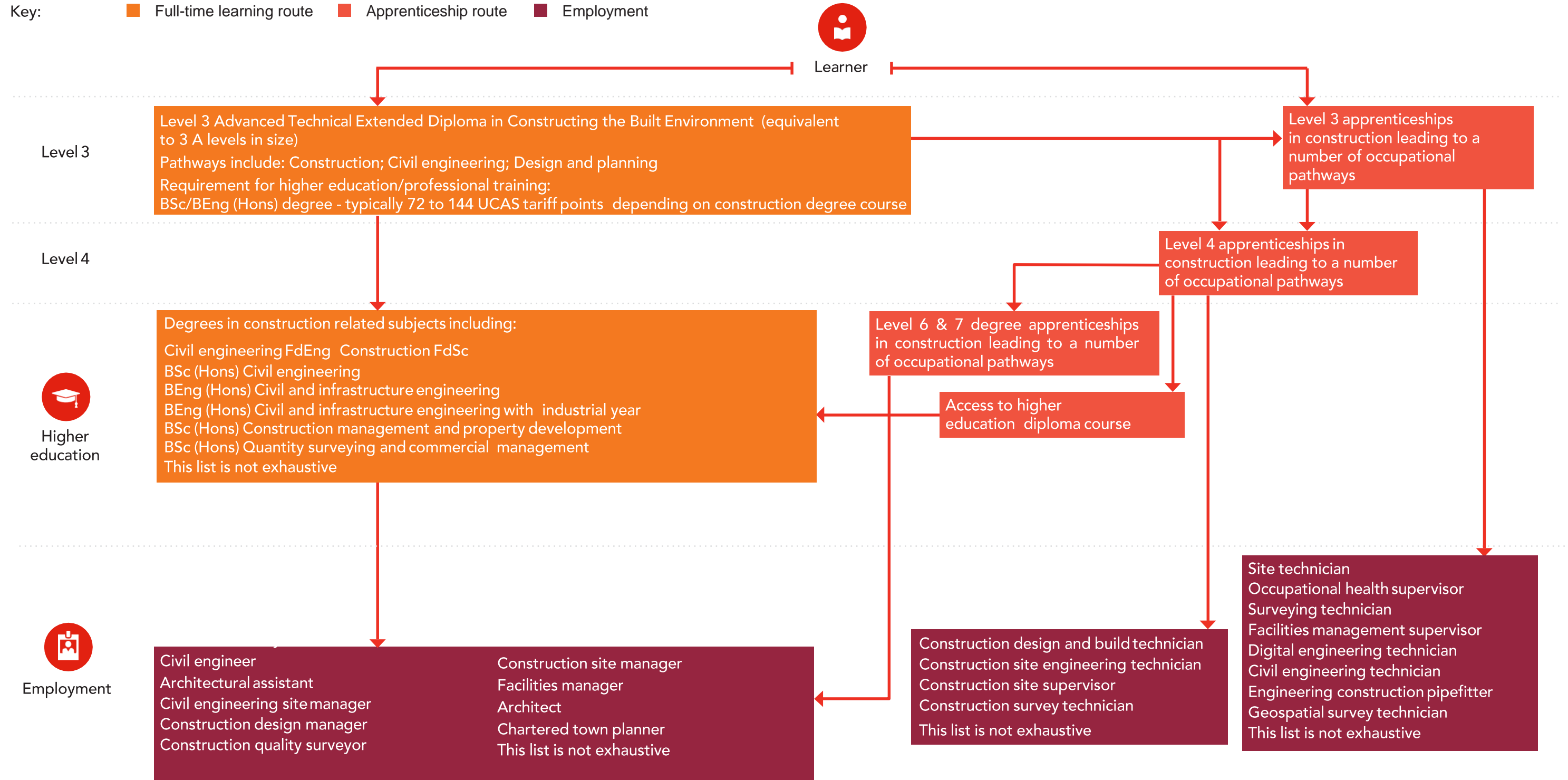


Your career in construction (built environment sector) starts here

City & Guilds have numerous qualifications for learners who are interested in developing specific technical and professional skills in the built environment sector. Learners can choose between Technical Qualifications and apprenticeships which can progress into meaningful employment or higher education (university).

Requirements: Centres will set their own entry requirements. Typically 5 GCSEs grades C/4 and above including: maths, English and science. Level 2 apprenticeships and Level 1 and 2 full-time programmes are available for those not meeting entry requirements. We strongly advise learners to contact their preferred university or college for details on courses and entry requirements.

- On completion of Level 3, learners can apply for membership to professional institutions such as the CIOB
- On completion of a degree graduates can apply for professional membership to institutions such as the CIOB after completing a level 6 or with site management experience

Please note that most principal contractors and major house builders require construction workers to hold a valid CSCS card, which can only be gained through an apprenticeship or employer sponsored qualification.
